BEY VERSUS MOUNTBATTEN

0639 29 November 1940

Background: A nighttime German sweep of the Channel netted only a few small fry. On turning towards their base, however, the Germans fell in with Mountbatten's 5th Destroyer Flotilla.

N^	German Division 1 is on a course of 180, in line ahead, 21 inches from the north edge and 36 inches from the west edge.
	British Division 1 is on a course of 270, in line abreast, 22 inches from the north edge and 41 inches from the west edge. Javelin is northernmost with the other ships in line to the south.


Victory Conditions: for each side, 1 point per destroyer sunk or left dead in the water.

Special Rules:

- 1. The visibility base is -2 with a gunfire modifier of -8 murky weather.
- 2. Neither side may alter course or speed until it spots the other.

Outcome: The Germans put two torpedoes into Javelin, blowing off her bow and stern. The RN destroyers made no torpedo attacks, and missed with their main guns. The British towed the shattered Javelin to Plymouth while the Germans retired to Brest.

Twelve Ls and Ms were similar, but with 4.7 inch guns in turrets (range 21 inches) and 2 quadruple torpedo mounts. GR space is the Gearing Room. Treat hits on it as Engine Room hits, although it floods separately.
